# GUIDELINES

**Eligibility:** Any person with a “tour passport” who can show proof of motorcycle license endorsement by sending a photocopy of their license with completed passport (passenger not required to have endorsement). Only one passport per person accepted.

**Couples:** Couples (riding on the same motorcycle) must use separate “tour passports” to be eligible for prizes.

**Completion Date:** December 31, 2022 all “tour passports” and/or pictures must be post-marked by January 15, 2023.

**Categories:** There will be five categories for the tour; North, Central and South Point of Interest Tours, the ABCs of Indiana Tour, and the Sponsor Tour.

**Tour Patches:** Tour patches will be awarded to first time participants and rockers for those who previously participated.

# AWARD PACKAGE

- 1 A drawing will be held no later than the ABATE Awards Banquet in February 2023.
- 2 A total of \$1,500 cash prizes will be given away.
- 3 The TOTAL cash prize will be divided equally between the tours. \$900 will be divided between the North, Central and South Points of Interest Tours. \$300 will be awarded to the ABCs of Indiana tour. \$300 will be awarded to the Sponsor tour.
- 4 There are a maximum of 120 chances per passport that can be accumulated from the Tour for the drawing of the cash prizes. Participants are eligible to win all cash prizes.
- 5 Anyone accumulating all 120 chances will automatically receive a one-year ABATE of Indiana membership.
- 6 Anyone completing one Points-of-Interest Tour and the ABCs of Indiana Tour will qualify for one chance at an all-events pass for 2023. Additional chances can be earned by adding a picture of the ABATE of Indiana state office, the Indiana State Motorcycle Safety Memorial and/or Coliseum Bingo (Freedom Hall). A total of four chances can be earned for an all-events pass. There will be 14 passes given away.
- 7 If less than three participants complete either category of the tour, the money will be divided equally among those who have participated in any of the tours.

# HOW THE TOUR WORKS

Think of the ABATE of Indiana's "Tour Indiana" program as a statewide scavenger hunt designed to encourage people to get out and ride. If that wasn't incentive enough, you can also win cash prizes! How, you ask?

**POINTS OF INTEREST** Participants may visit the points of interest listed in this passport. Participants may ride the North Tour (Regions 0, 1, 2, 3, 4), Central Tour (Regions 5, 6, 11, 12) or South Tour (Regions 7, 8, 9, 10, 13) separately, any combination of two, or all three. A Point of Interest is listed in each Region (two in Region 11). There are five points of interest in each of the North, Central and South Tours (15 total). Participants simply take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the point of interest, while displaying the cover of the tour book. Couples (riding the same motorcycle) can take a picture of each other with their motorcycle, while displaying the cover page of the tour book. Participants will qualify for 2 chances per picture to win cash prizes for each of these tours they complete.

**ABCs OF INDIANA** Participants must take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the name of a city, town or county sign using the alphabet A through Z (there is no X), while displaying the cover of the tour book. Couples (riding the same motorcycle) can take a picture of each other with their motorcycle, while displaying the cover of the tour book. A picture of five of the State Parks and/or State/National Forests is also needed. Participants will receive two chances for each letter of the alphabet, State/National Park or State/National Forest submitted. There are a total of 60 chances available for this tour.

**SPONSOR TOUR** Visit a sponsor listed on the inside back cover. Participants must take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the business signage while displaying the cover of the tour book (15 total). Participants will qualify for 2 chances per picture to win cash prizes for this tour. Only one sponsor can be submitted under the same name (i.e. "Pomp's Tire" can only be submitted one time, even though they are listed multiple times). There are currently 31 Sponsors available to choose from for this tour.

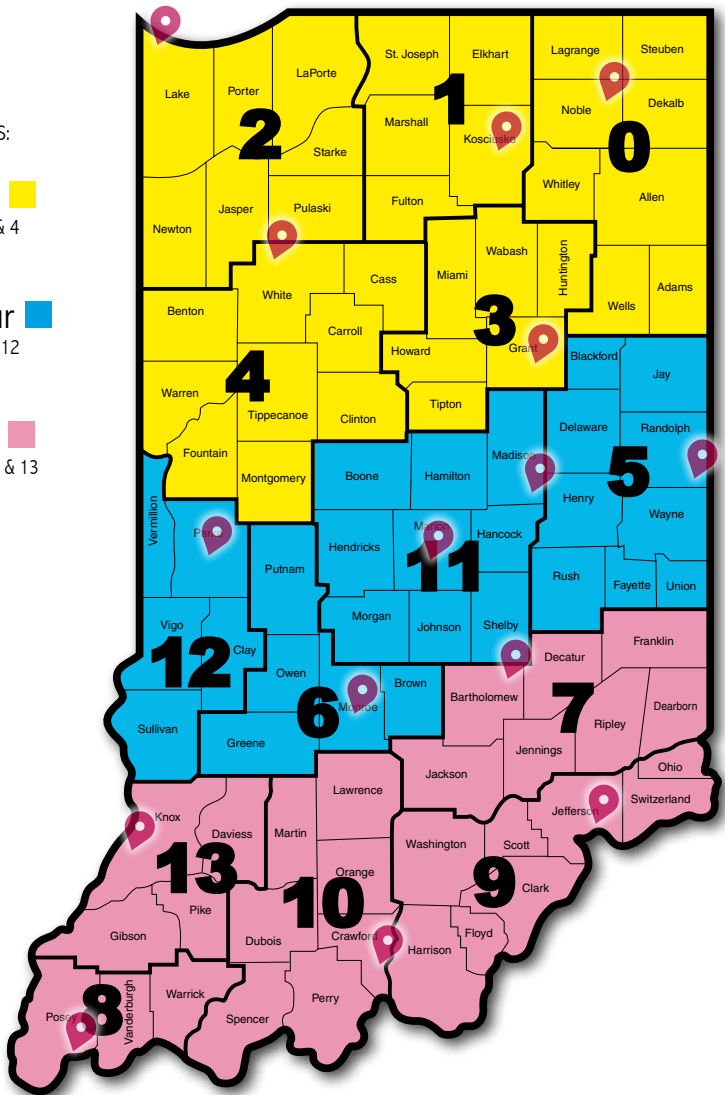

## MID-AMERICA WINDMILL MUSEUM

The Kendallville Windmill Museum & Historical Society was incorporated in 1992 under the auspices of the Kendallville Local Development Corporation to create a tourist attraction for the area. There are a total of fifty-two windmills that have been restored and are on exhibit in the museum barn or outside on the museum grounds. A highlight of the museum is a replica of the Robertson Post windmill, a single stone grist mill with a 52' diameter wind wheel. The original Robertson was shipped from England and erected on the James River near Jamestown, VA, in the 1620's. This is the only museum to have all eleven Flint and Walling models beginning with the original STAR which was patented in the 1870's and sold for 40 years. The museum also includes the STAR ZEPHYR, the last windmill manufactured by Flint and Walling. It was introduced in 1937 and continued until 1954 when Flint and Walling ceased windmill production. Museum hours are Tuesday to Friday 10 AM to 4 PM Saturday 10 AM to 5 PM Sunday 1 PM to 4 PM and admission is only \$8 per person. \$6 for us old fogies.

## **POUND STORE MUSEUM**

This stop comes courtesy of an ABC's tour submission, hint you can get two stops in one. The Pound Store is located in Oswego and is the oldest commercial building in the county. It was donated to the Kosciusko County Historical Society by Mr and Mrs Pound in 1968 and has since been placed on the National Register of historic places. The present town of Oswego and Pound Store Museum are situated on the site of a Pottawatomie Village and the land was owned by Pottawatomie Chief Musquawbuck. This land was granted to him by the Federal Government in 1832 but was later taken away. However Chief Musquawbuck stayed and raised his family.

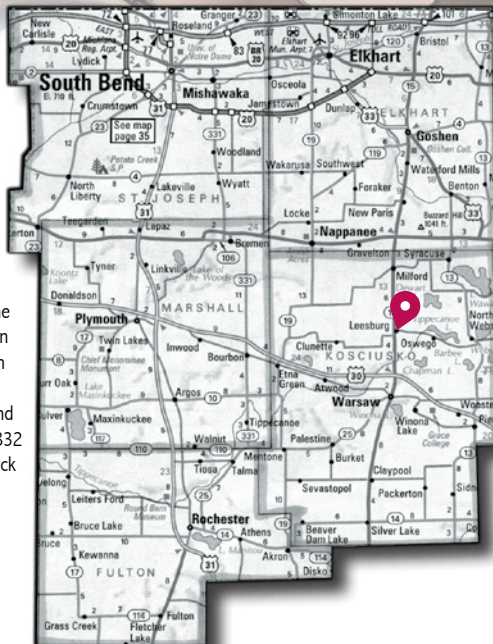

The mascot Hall of Fame is the Hall of Fame for sports mascots in North America founded by David Raymond, the original Philly Phanatic, in 2005. Originally founded as an online-only hall, the mascot Hall of Fame has inducted 17 professional and college mascots. In 2013, Raymond began exploring the idea of a physical Mascot Hall of Fame museum with the city of Whiting. Soon after, feasibility studies and economic analysis of long-term viability were completed. A financing package was approved by the city of Whiting development Commission and a nonprofit operating entity was created. Designs for the building, interior exhibits, and interactive experiences were completed, construction began in 2016 culminating in a soft opening on December 26th 2018 and official grand opening ceremony with ribbon cutting on Saturday April 6 2019. Museum hours are Thursday 4 PM to 7 PM, Friday 10 AM to 5 PM and Saturday 10 AM to 5 PM. The first Friday of every month is free admission courtesy of Notre Dame Federal Credit Union.

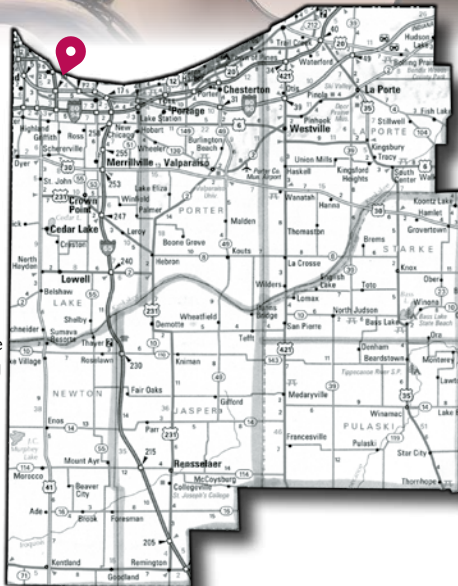

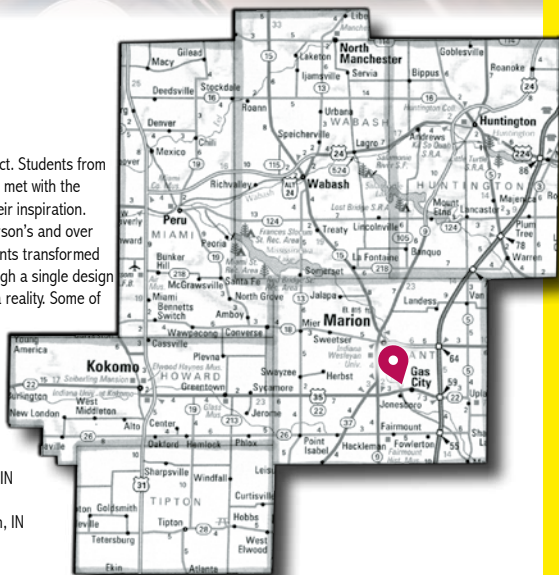

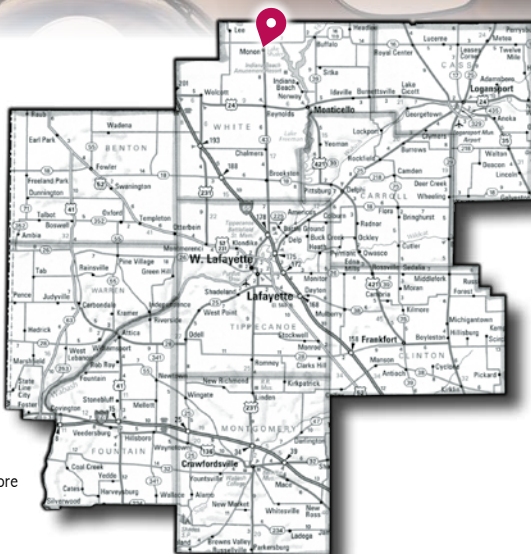
Here is another of Indiana's roadside attractions that nourishes the mind as well as the body. Located two miles north of SR 16 on the west side of US 421, you can spot it by all the railroad paraphernalia. The restaurant and museum feature historic artifacts, explorable train cars and a set of miniature trains that chug from room to room on railways suspended from the ceiling. The Whistle Stop Restaurant serves typical American fare, including hamburgers and sandwiches, along with a few more interesting selections such as peppermint milkshakes. ## HOOSIER HILL (highest point in Indiana)

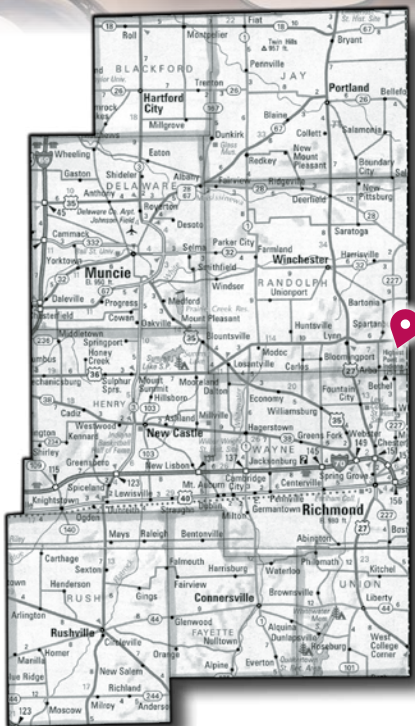
This point of interest speaks for itself. Hoosier Hill located in a small patch of woods south of the intersection of Elliott & Randolph Roads, your best picture is a small green sign on the road. But the fun picture would be back the short gravel drive that ends at a walk path to the marker. In 2005, an Eagle Scout candidate named Kyle Cummings (Troop 820 from Lakeside Park, Kentucky), in cooperation with the property owner Kim E. Goble, built a trail, sign and picnic area at the high point. There is also a bench near the marker. If you want to calibrate your altimeter, it is 1,255 feet above sea level. The marker says 1,257 but this was recorded using an outdated technique. If you get there early enough in the season, you should be able to see the marker from the drive.

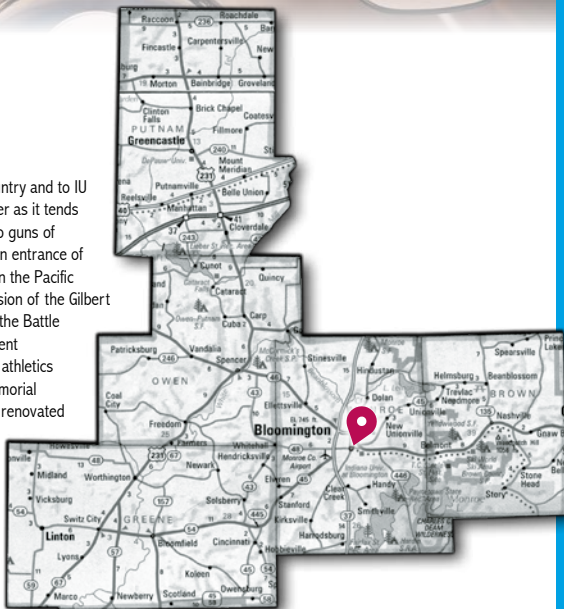
This point of interest is in the heart of Hoosier country and to IU football. So, plan your stop for the spring or summer as it tends to get busy in the fall. The prow, mainmast, and two guns of the USS Indiana (BB-58) are erected at the western entrance of the stadium. The battleship saw extensive service in the Pacific Theater during World War II, taking part in the invasion of the Gilbert Islands, Marshall Islands, Marianas campaign, and the Battle of Iwo Jima and earning nine battle stars. The current stadium officially opened in 1960 as part of a new athletics area at the university and replaced the original Memorial Stadium built in 1925. Memorial Stadium has been renovated or updated multiple times since the original construction. Improvements include the replacement of the original wooden seats with aluminum bleachers, installation of sound and lighting systems, and major structural overhauls.

## YELLOW TRAIL MUSEUM

Located on the SW corner of Main & Jackson St in Hope, this museum recounts the surprising history of Hope Indiana. However, it started out as an advertising gimmick. In the early 1900's Elda Spaugh, the owner of a garage and filling station. Mr Spaugh realized there were not enough cars in Hope to make his business a success, so he traveled to all the towns in about a 50 mile radius around Hope. As he returned from each town, he painted yellow bands around fence posts and utility poles along the route. He then mailed out

business cards that stated, "Spaugh's Garage, The Home of the Yellow Trail". The public was challenged to follow the Yellow Trail to Hope, Indiana. On the reverse side of the card was a map showing all the surrounding towns with routes leading into Hope. Curiosity got the best of many of those receiving these cards. People would take drives to see if they could actually follow the Yellow Trail to Hope. Since the road conditions were so poor at that time, the drivers often had problems with their cars on the path. By the time they arrived in Hope, they were in need of gasoline, tires, or other car parts. This kept Mr. Spaugh in business until there were enough automobiles in town to keep him busy.

## JOHN T MYERS LOCKS & DAM

Located at the end of Raben Rd, the Locks & Dam are roughly the furthest southwestern part of Indiana we can ride to. Formerly known as the Uniontown Locks and Dam, it was renamed

by an act of Congress in 1996 as a tribute to recently retired Congressman John T. Myers. It is the 17th Lock and dam on the Ohio River located 846 miles downstream of Pittsburgh about 3 miles downstream from Uniontown, Kentucky. There are two locks, one for commercial barge traffic that is 1,200 feet long by 110 feet wide, and the auxiliary lock is 600 feet long by 110 feet wide. This United States Army Corps of Engineers facility is in Posey County, Indiana, and Union County, Kentucky. The project was authorized as replacement for existing Locks and Dam 48 and 49 on September 17, 1958, by Secretary of the Army under authority of Section 6 of the Rivers and Harbors Act approved March 3, 1909, as amended.

## SCHOFIELD HOUSE

The first residents of the house were Alexander and Drusilla Lanier, they or William Robinson may have had the house built to begin with in 1817. Records are not clear about this. The house originally had a bedroom, kitchen, and a tavern room on the first floor, and a sleeping lot and meeting room on the second floor.

On January 13, 1818, fourteen Masons throughout Indiana met at the upstairs meeting room, after agreeing to meet there to establish a Grand Lodge for Indiana the previous month in Corydon, Indiana.

Alexander Lanier was a Freemason. James Lanier, son of Alexander and Drusilla, sold the building and it would remain in the hands of the Schofield Family. Charlotte Schofield and her daughter made an agreement to sell the house to the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite when Charlotte could no longer live in the home. The property was purchased in 1972 for \$25,000. The property was placed on the Historic Roles in Madison and named the Schofield House per historical convention of the time.

## STEPHERSON GENERAL STORE

This historic General Store in Leavenworth offers unique shopping, a friendly diner-style menu and groceries! A laundromat that services campers and residents. The hardware store is located in the basement. Closed on Sundays. This is the old kind of general store to which your grandparents would have gone shopping. The store has been a landmark in the community since the early 1900's and continues to maintain old charm with modern shopping conveniences.

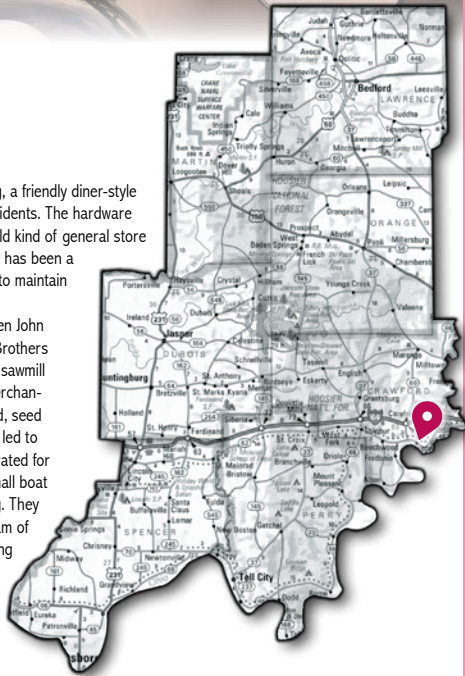
The story of Stephenson's General Store begins in 1917 when John Ed Stephenson and his three oldest sons purchased the Conrad Brothers Hardware Store, originally built in the 1870s. John Ed had been a sawmill operator and a school teacher. The Stephensons added to the merchandise, including groceries, harnesses, harness repair supplies, feed, seed and farm implements. They also maintained a casket house which led to another family business, the Stephenson Funeral Home. This operated for 50 years. Sometimes they would be called on to take a skiff (a small boat not a typo) across the Ohio River to pick up a body for embalming. They owned an elaborate horse drawn hearse and hired a matched team of horses from the local livery stable for funerals. The present building was built from materials salvaged from the original after the 1937 flood.

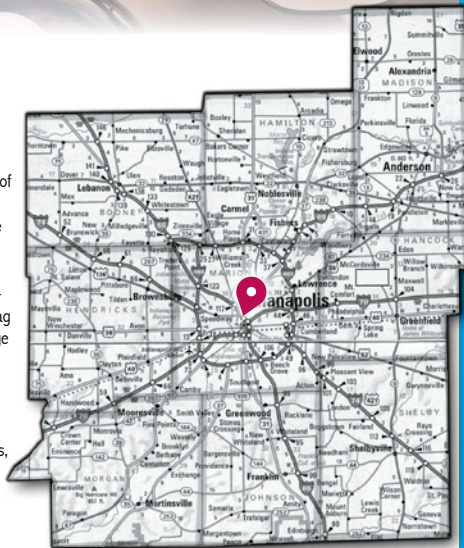

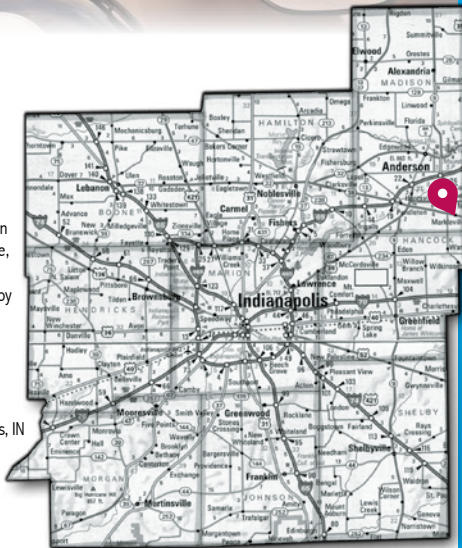

## STATE SANATORIUM COVERED BRIDGE

The Sanatorium Covered Bridge is located 2.2 miles west of SR 59 on county road 100 N. Sorry, there is about 2 miles of gravel if you approach from the east however there is only a mile if you come in from the west.

The bridge was originally built on the property of the State Sanatorium, located a mile or so from its current site, for hauling coal to the Sanatorium. Prior to the bridge it was hauled from Rockville across the Plank Road Bridge to the Sanatorium. The Plank Road Bridge was washed out in the flood of 1913 and was replaced with the Howard Bridge, also built by Britton the same year.

Being on private property after the State sold the Sanatorium, the bridge fell into disrepair. On July 30, 2008 the \$1.34 million project to move the bridge to the former site of the Adams Covered Bridge was started. The Adams Bridge had been located about a mile upstream and had been built in 1907 by J.P. Van Fossen. In 1969 the Adams bridge was destroyed by a flood where it washed downstream and under the Sanatorium Bridge. During February 3-11, 1970, the Jessup Covered Bridge was moved to replace the destroyed Adams bridge. Again in 1989 flood waters would wash Jessup Bridge downstream and under the Sanatorium Bridge and over the U.S. 36 bridge. By December 29, 2008 the State Sanatorium Bridge was moved and open to traffic. So you could say this bridge has stood over both the Adams & Jessup covered bridges.

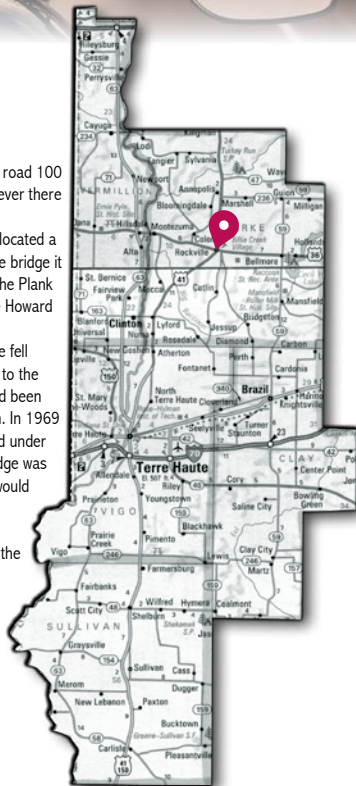

## FORT KNOX II

Fort Knox II Site was an important military outpost used by the United States Army from 1803 to 1813. Captain Zachary Taylor strengthened Fort Knox with a stockade in 1811. Governor William Henry Harrison mustered his army at Fort Knox II and marched up the Wabash River to the Battle of Tippecanoe at Prophetstown (near present-day Lafayette, Ind.) on Nov. 7, 1811. After the battle, the troops returned to Fort Knox at Vincennes; several died there from their wounds.

In 1813, as the War of 1812 increased the chances of attacks on Vincennes by Native Americans, the military determined that Fort Knox was too far away to protect the town. Fort Knox II was disassembled, floated down the Wabash, and reassembled just a few yards from where Fort Knox I had been.

The former Fort Knox II site was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1982 and is now preserved close to present-day Ouabache Trails Park on the outskirts of Vincennes. The outline of the former fort has been marked with short posts, and there is interpretive signage in a park setting.

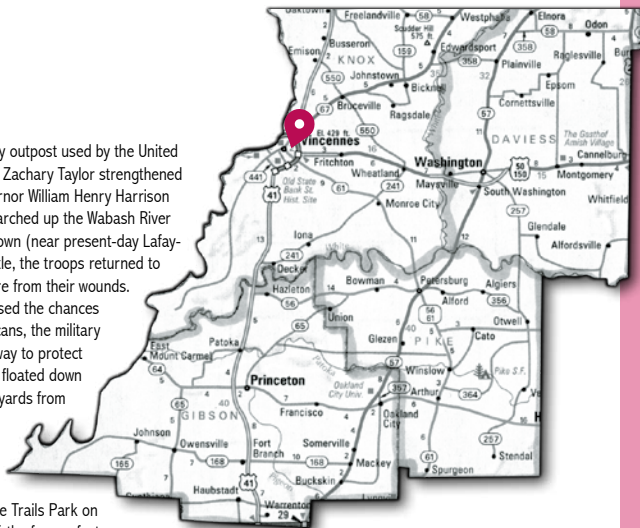
